
SEPARATION OF POWERS

Under the Westminster System



THE LEGISLATURE

A bicameral parliament made up of the House of Representatives, the Senate, and the Governor General (as the Queen's representative) to debate, change, and pass Australian laws. Members are elected by the people.

THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

The Cabinet - government ministers headed by the Prime Minister.

The Executive puts laws into action and action action

The Executive puts laws into action and administers them through government agencies.





THE JUDICIARY

Judges interpret the Constitution and administer Australian laws through all levels of the federal courts, including the High Court.

The rule of law provides checks and balances through the separation of powers to avoid arbitrary rule
